Letter from Executive Director

The Children's Advocacy Center of the Bluegrass's mission is to reduce the trauma experienced by child victims of sexual abuse. This year, over 1,000 children came to the Center to receive services in our child-friendly, safe, welcoming building. Every day our dedicated team members help put children on the path to healing and hope by providing coordinated services like forensic interviews, medical exams, therapy and counseling, and family advocacy.

Looking back at FY 2023, the Center has much to be proud of. We grew our staff and board, adding three new positions and three new board members to help us advance our work across Central Kentucky. We developed and implemented a new training program on best practice protocols for law enforcement, child protective services, County and Commonwealth's Attorneys, and school personnel. We hosted a series of open house events to highlight our programs and build stronger partnerships with local service providers. We procured funding for a new van to help with Center transportation needs. And, we built, opened, and dedicated "Kristin's Closet" a resource closet for children and families in crisis named in memory of beloved former program director Kristin Jenkins.

We were able to do all these things thanks to the incredible support of our community partners and donors. Thank you for being there alongside us to bring hope and healing to children in Central Kentucky.

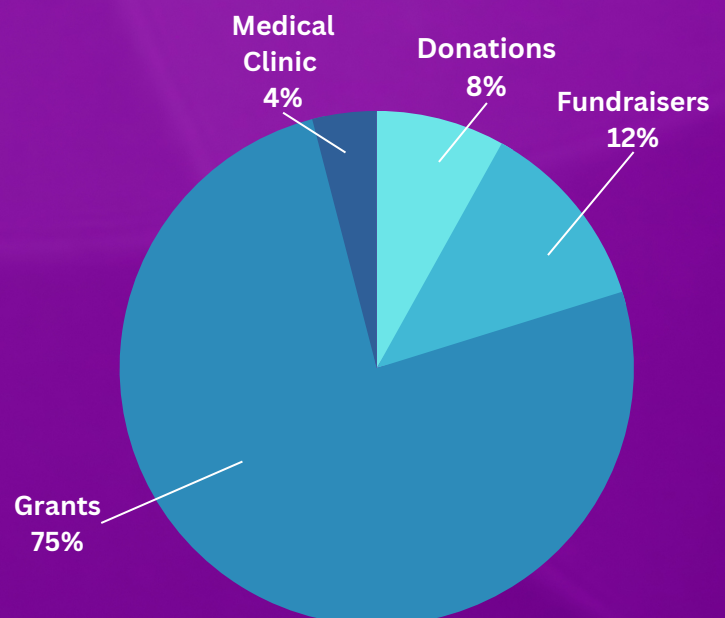
